SUMMER YOUTH WORK PROGRAM APPLICATION

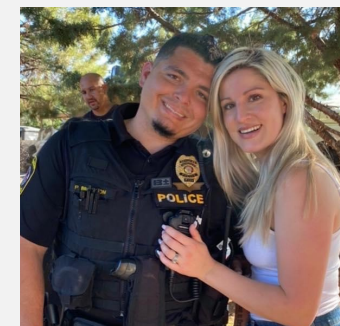

COMMUNITY SUPPORT FOR SGT. PRESTON BROGDON



We continue to pray for Yavapai-Apache Nation Police Sergeant Preston Brogdon, as he recovers from the February 9th shooting that left him seriously injured. Sergeant Brogdon is a Marine Corps veteran who has been with the Yavapai-Apache Police Department for five years. He is a husband and the father of four young children.

ACTIVE RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions passed by Tribal Council in response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19):

- 50-20 Adopting Emergency Council Procedures During Coronavirus (COVID-19) Outbreak
- 60-20 Declaring a State of Emergency Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Outbreak Authorizes the Executive Offices of the Chairman and Vice-Chairwoman (the "Executive") to coordinate emergency and disaster relief and seek assistance from federal, state, other tribal governments, and local and private agencies to address the public health emergency created by the Coronavirus.
- 95-20 Approving a Reopening of the Cliff Castle Casino and Hotel Under a Reopening Operations Plan and Requiring Implementation of Ongoing Coronavirus (COVID-19) Public Safety Measures
Approval to re-open Cliff Castle Casino Hotel on June 1, 2020 at 10am with safety measures implemented.
- 104-21 Adopting the revised Yavapai-Apache Nation COVID-19 Workplace Safety Policy, the Yavapai-Apache Nation Subordinate Economic Organization (SEO) COVID-19 Workplace Safety Plan, and the Yavapai-Apache Nation COVID-19 Safety Policy for Committees, Commissions, and Boards
Reduce face-to-face business where feasible. Employees who are not full vaccinated must wear a mask when they are within 6 feet of other persons, unless there is a plexiglass partition between the employee and other persons. Employees must also ask their clients, vendors, and customers who are not fully vaccinated to wear a mask if they are within 6 feet of other persons.
- 98-21 Rescinding Tribal Council Resolutions Nos. 70-20, 84-20, and 214-20
The stay-at-home order, closure of the Yavapai-Apache Nation Reservation Lands, and the curfew are lifted, as well as the restrictions on social events within the Nation's Lands. The YAN COVID-19 Workplace Safety Policy, the YAN COVID-19 Safety Policy for Committees, Commissions, and Boards, and the YAN Subordinate Economic Organization Workplace Safety Policy remain in effect.
- 141-21 Revisions to the Yavapai-Apache Nation COVID-19 Workplace Safety Policy, Subordinate Economic Organization (SEO) COVID-19 Workplace Safety Policy, and COVID-19 Safety Policy for Tribal Council, Committees, Commissions, and Boards
The Tribal Council has reviewed and approved revisions to the above policies effective immediately except the COVID-19 testing requirement in the Yavapai-Apache Nation COVID-19 Workplace Safety Policy which is effective August 30, 2021.
- 207-21 Amendments to the COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program Policy
The COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program Policy now reflects Treasury guidance on the allowable uses of the assistance and documentation requirements to verify eligibility for assistance.
