### **POSITION DESCRIPTION:.**

The Animal Control Officer is responsible for enforcing the Nation's Animal Control Ordinances.

## **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Must have a valid Arizona Driver's License and be insurable with the Nation's auto insurance policy and sustain insurability throughout the duration of employment.

- Evidence of continuing education to maintain any required certifications/licenses and update knowledge and skills.

# DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Patrols the Yavapai-Apache Nation community, including off-road sites, in a radio-equipped vehicle to enforce animal control rules, ordinances and laws.
- Arranges special programs such as rabies and licensing clinics.
- Responds to complaints of animals at large and takes appropriate action.
- Assists other law enforcement personnel as assigned.
- Supports and interfaces with other employees and Tribal members.
- Conducts, attends, and interacts in meetings with Yavapai-Apache Nation personnel, other public agencies and the public.
- Maintains professional education and interaction at meetings/conferences to keep abreast of changes in requirements, which affect the Nation and current trends in the field.
- Maintains a positive working relationship with other Tribal employees.
- Participates in various Nation work groups.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

## **Physical Requirements**

The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to ten (60) pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, peripheral vision, depth perception and ability to adjust focus. The noise level in the environment is typical of an office setting. While performing the duties of this job the employee is required to sit; talk or hear; stand; walk; use hands to finger, handle or operate objects, tools or controls; and reach with hands and arms.
