GENERAL ELECTION WINNERS SWORN IN

The Yavapai-Apache Nation's new Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Councilmember were sworn in during the Nation's Inauguration ceremony on October 5, 2022 at Cliff Castle Casino-Hotel. Chairwoman Tanya Lewis was elected to lead the Nation after



garnering more than 52% of the votes in the General Election. Ricardo Pacheco won the race for Vice Chairperson with more than 73% of the vote and Councilmember Charlie Baca was elected to office after receiving nearly 23% of the vote in his race.
