#### RESOLUTION NO. 47 - 2023 OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE YAVAPAI-APACHE NATION

A Resolution Authorizing the Nation to Submit a Grant Application to the Arizona
Companion Animal Spay and Neuter Committee to Assist the Nation in Controlling
the Feral Cat Population on the Nation's Lands

- WHEREAS: The Yavapai-Apache Tribal Council ("Council") is authorized to represent the Yavapai-Apache Nation ("Nation") and act on all matters that concern the health and welfare of the Nation, and to make decisions not inconsistent with or contrary to the Constitution of the Yavapai-Apache Nation ("Constitution") as provided under Article V(a) of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS: The Council is authorized to negotiate and enter into agreements with federal, state, and local governments and to accept grant funds as provided under Article V (b) and (s), respectively, of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS: The Council is authorized to manage all tribal economic affairs and to appropriate and regulate the use of the Nation's funds as provided under Article V (i) and (k), respectively, of the Constitution; and
- **WHEREAS:** The Nation's Contracts and Grants Manager recommends that the Nation apply for grant funding as follows:
  - (1) Funding Agency: Arizona Companion Animal Spay and Neuter Committee
  - (2) Amount of funding application: \$10,000
  - (3) Term of grant: 1 year
  - (4) Matching funds and source: None
  - (5) Nation's Department or Program administering the grant: YAPD Animal Control
  - (6) Purpose and use of grant funds: Funds will be used to control the Feral Cat population on the Nation's lands through a spay and neuter program.
  - (7) Budget attached or not required: Attached
- **WHEREAS:** The Tribal Council finds it in the Nation's best interest to authorize the above-described grant application.
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Yavapai-Apache Tribal Council, in Council assembled, at which a quorum is present, hereby authorizes the Nation to apply for grant funding to the above-named funding agency in the amount and for the term described above.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Nation agrees that it will comply with all program guidelines and regulations applicable to the above referenced grant program and the certifications required in the grant application; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Council authorizes the Nation's Contracts and Grants Manager to take all actions necessary to complete the grant application and to submit all necessary information to the funding agency in furtherance of the grant application and authorizes the Nation to receive and expend the grant funds in accordance with the grant requirements and the Nation's Budget Code and Financial Policies.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Chairwoman, and Vice Chairman, or either of them, are hereby authorized to take such further action as deemed necessary to carry out the intent and purposes of this Resolution.

#### TNR AZ PET PLATE GRANT

In the communities of the Yavapai-Apache Nation there is a large feral cat population. Animal Control would like to start up a Trap Neuter Release (TNR) program to help reduce the population of the feral cats in the community. Animal control has reached out to Tiny Paws Rescue and has worked out a program for efficient trapping and to be able to serve all communities in Camp Verde, Rimrock, and Clarkdale of the Yavapai-Apache Nation. Through this program Animal Control will be able to give options to residents of the Yavapai-Apache Nation for the feral cat colonies.

There is no program in place for the feral cat population, so with this there has been a large number of kittens in the communities alongside adult cats. Animal Control does not have a contract with an animal shelter of any kind, so there is not even an option of removing the cats unless there is room in a shelter or rescue to receive them. Animal Control has removed at least ten kittens and one mother cat, who were then released to Tiny Paws where the mother was spayed and the kittens were socialized and able to be adopted into homes. Tiny Paws has also been able to trap, spay or neuter at the Cliff Castle Casino. Just recently one home owner reported to have 20 cats living near their residence all with litters of kittens. We estimate there is approximately over 100 feral cats living on each Reservation.

We are requesting the full \$10,000.00 to spay and neuter as many cats as we can to get a jump start on the program. We know that TNR is effective over multiple years and plan to keep the program going to reduce the cat population. With the \$10,000, we project we can spay or neuter approximately 80 cats depending on the amount of pregnant females that come through the program.

The program will be ran by Animal Control who is under the Yavapai-Apache Police Department. There is only one Animal Control Officer so with the help from Tiny Paws Rescue there is more opportunity to trap more cats and cover more area. If there is a home owner that has a feral cat issue, they will contact Animal Control and the Animal Control Officer will go out and assess the situation. Animal Control will then forward the home owner information to one of the volunteers for Tiny Paws. Tiny Paws will contact the home owner and set up a time to come out and trap. The cats will be trap with a standard live animal trap or a larger trap in the case of trapping kittens and mother cats.

Once the cats are trapped they will be transported to one of the approved vets that are in conjunction with the TNR program. As of right now, we are partnering with Anasazi Animal Clinic and Montezuma Veterinary Services in Camp Verde Az. All cats will either be spayed or neutered, their ear will be "tipped," and they will receive a rabies vaccination. Invoices will be collected weekly by the Animal Control Officer and turned into the finance department for proper payment.

After recovering at the vet office, the adult cats will be released back into the area that they were trapped in. If any kittens are trapped and look like they can be socialized, they will be taken in by Tiny Paws Rescue to be socialized and adopted into homes. With the removal of kittens there will be less cats in the community and they will live out their lives in homes instead as feral cats.

We have acquired \$3,000.00 to help cover the rabies vaccinations and to add funds to the program and purchased 2 live traps for this program (Pending Council approval).

The Yavapai-Apache Nation is making spay and neuter a priority along with animal welfare. Animal Control plans to promote spaying and neutering by being active in local events, especially youth events. We plan on explaining the TNR program to the community and the

benefits of having this program long term. We plan on using our social media to promote TNR alongside promoting the Arizona Pet Friendly License Plate logo. We will explain that the program would mostly be funded through this grant and promote the purchasing of the Arizona pet friendly License Plate. We plan to put out flyers to the community alongside emails about the program with the logo.
