This position will determine and motivate the client to improve their condition and help them change their behaviors and enter a treatment plan. Throughout treatment, the substance use counselor will use positive reinforcement to encourage patients to abstain from drugs.

- Intermediate computer skills for record-keeping and documentation.
- Detail orientated with good writing and organization abilities.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Meet with clients to assess their substance issues
- Write treatment and recovery plans
- Identify recovery interference situations

- Educate client on coping mechanisms
- Conduct group therapy sessions for clients
- Help clients identify support groups to maintain their recovery
- Maintain records of client, assessing their status and implementing new treatment or therapy needs.
- Manage all aspects of clients' addiction, starting from the date when the client enters the facility until the date of their discharge.
- Update the legal system about clients' progress (tribal and state)
- Assist client with discharge plan and aftercare
- Communicate with client and family members in cases where client is underage and under the care of their family members.
- Develop crisis management plans, both for care while client is receiving services and transition back to daily lives. Counselor will assist with identifying coping skills, sponsors and safe spaces.
- Collaborate with other health care professionals such as psychiatrists, doctors, nurses, social workers and law enforcement officials.
- Utilize the following modalities for counseling both individual and group:
 - Cognitive- behavioral therapy
 - Dialectical behavioral therapy
 - o 12 step facilitation plan
 - Family counseling
 - o Motivational interviewing
